Dear Mr. Thompson:

It has been brought to our attention that, through your Norton 360, your company is describing SpyHunter as a security threat to users. This action is entirely unjustified, and Enigma Software Group, Inc. demands that you cease and desist immediately.

This designation is entirely baseless. You have absolutely no justification for listing SpyHunter as a "threat," and your actions can only be understood as an effort to promote your product while discouraging customers from purchasing products from Enigma Software Group. We note in this regard that our products do not satisfy any of the "major threat components" found in the Threat Severity Assessment criteria posted on your own website. In addition, your treatment of SpyHunter in this manner directly impedes our customers' ability to use our product for its intended purpose.

By falsely listing SpyHunter as a "threat," you are violating several United States laws, including but not limited to those governing unfair competition. Your actions are causing our company substantial damages and we demand you immediately cease and desist.

You are hereby on notice that Enigma Software Group, Inc. intends to fully protect its legal rights. You must immediately remove any reference to Enigma Software Group from your website(s) and software. If this situation is not corrected within 3 (three) business days, we will file a lawsuit in Federal Court seeking equitable relief and damages.
